#### ACTIVITIES ROUNDUP

- Musical- Monticello High School will be producing the musical Beauty and the Beast this fall. First rehearsals begin on Monday, September 11.
   Approximately 80+ Monticello High School students will participate in some aspect of this production. Performances will be on November 17 and 18 at 7:00 pm and November 19 at 3:00 pm.
- Volleyball- kicking off the 2023 season with a tough schedule vs. several ranked and/or Class AAAA opponents (Buffalo AAAA; Rogers #5 in AAAA & Delano #11 in AAA). With a 0-3 record, the team filled with many newcomers getting used to the Varsity court continues to work hard and is looking forward to playing at a high level as we reach conference play.
- Girls Tennis- is 4-6, we have had a lot of matches right away as the season has started. Won first conference match. Beat St. Michael, Coon Rapids, Anoka and Chisago Lakes.
- · Sophie Rosh and Adah Mattson are our captains this season! Looking forward to our three match weeks starting this week.
- Girls Cross Country- We had our first meet at Princeton and finished 4th. Our junior varsity placed 2nd. Isabel Mahoney won the race and broke her own school 5K record in a time of 18:11.
- Boys Cross Country- Good start to season with win at Big Lake in our only meet so far. Boys have been working hard and look good. Currently ranked 12th in state but would expect that to improve as we get more meets under our belt.
- Girls Swimming and Diving- started off where we left off last season. Already performing above last year at this time with best times and diving scores. We are 2-0 in dual meets. 2 pool records (Monticello pool) have been broken by Adalynn Biegler 200 IM(from 2013) and 500 free(from 2010).
- Football- is 1-0 after an exciting victory against Bemidji. We are looking forward to the first home game Friday, September 8 against Alexandria.
- Boys Soccer- a 1-3-1 start to our season. Played 4 teams that ended their season last year ranked in the top 10 in state. This challenging start to our year will certainly pay off in the long run, as we set our sights on a conference championship and a high seed in our Section tournament.
- Girls Soccer- Varsity is off to a great start, going 3-0-1 with 3 shutouts in our first 4 games, and our new-to-varsity players have quickly adjusted to the higher speed and intensity of play. Our JV and JV2 team are also off to solid starts, and the talent coming up is giving confidence of more strong years ahead. Our hopes for this year are to repeat as conference champions and make another run towards the state tournament!
